### On the Course

## 7<sup>th</sup> Hole and winter green; an update

About two years ago it was decided to make the temporary winter green into an acceptable alternative green. After numerous attempts, which included re-turfing, reseeding, fertilising and a lot of staff time, it was reluctantly decided to discard the temporary green as a waste of time and money.

In general the overall plan for winter has been to use the approaches to the greens as temporary greens, as we are already investing money and time to improve the playing surfaces for the season and then subsequently the winter period. The current 7th temporary green (approach) has clearly not been a success, mainly due to some extreme winter conditions. There is also limited space around the 7th where we can locate a

temporary green and of course cost also presents a barrier to any further development. As part of the winter programme we hope to put a water system in front of the 7th green right hand bunker which will also help us to move the winter green to that area.

### **Course protection during the winter**

A big "thank you" to buggy users who are keeping to the rough and following the 90 degree rule. The extensive system of quality roping has also worked well in protecting the course.

A special plea; will players please keep buggies and trollies off the practice area to the right of the first tee? It has become a bit of a bog!!

#### On-going work on the course

- Leaf clearance is in hand and continues. It is still a major part of the week's work.
   Due to the prolonged summer temperatures, the leaves are hanging on slightly longer this year. Hopefully the recent frosts will fetch them all off but the leaf clearance will be ongoing into the new year.
- We do recognise that where the leaf collecting machine is potentially causing damage to the course a focus will be to use the handblowers to push leaves off the key areas to pathways for collection - this is of course more time consuming but a necessity.
- We hope to change a couple more mats and we have bought different colour flags –
  luminous green to indicate temporary greens. We will also be putting up a
  handrail to the 7th Tee. Many thanks to the Seniors Section who donated the
  money for the flags and additional new mats and handrail.
- Two weeks of solid frost have put planned development work on hold slightly. Greens haven't been micro tinned and will now be completed in the new year. The adverse weather has also put on hold any more turf cutting and development of bunkers.
- The bunkers that have been worked on are; 2 on the 5th fairway; right of the 6th green; 18th fairway bunker. Sand will be added once turf has knitted in.
- Pot holes on most paths have been filled as some were becoming very noticeable and potentially dangerous.
- The irrigation system is now completely drained off, to protect the system, with the last of the water drained just before the frost was forecast.
- Machinery service work has started and will be ongoing to have all machinery ready for the new year; machinery serviced so far includes greens mower, Gator, and tees mower.

• A new acquisition is the Pole saw. During the recent cold spell, all the right-hand side of the 1st fairway, including the big oaks growing out of the hedge, have been trimmed. It's a great tool to have and we plan to finish the rest of 1/18 and 2/10 and also 5/6 in the new year.

### Work which is to be continued through January/February

- Carry on with turf cutting for the smaller bunkers.
- Hopefully start the installation of new irrigation to 18th green, 7th surrounds and 9th surrounds.
- Verti drain all greens.
- Micro tine all greens
