### On the Course

- The new Aerator is now in action, allowing faster and wider micro-tining of the greens.
- Spin dressing on the greens keeps them running smoothly; we will probably use up to 20 tonnes of top dressing over the summer period.
- All the tees have been deep tined, allowing irrigation water to reach deeper levels. Special attention has been paid to seeding and dressing the par 3 tees, to encourage fuller grass growth.
- Those bunkers identified as needing attention will be worked on with a
  rolling programme of topping up the sand. Heavy rain has caused a lot of
  erosion of bunker faces and compaction, so constant raking 'BY ALL' is
  necessary.

- A sod's law of unforeseen machinery breakdowns, over a two month period, has caused problems with mowing the fairways and first cuts as well as ironing the greens, but hard work and imaginative temporary measures have got us through that.
- Early in August, a new irrigation pipe will be installed along the hedgerow towards the 1<sup>st</sup> green. This should take about 3 days, so temporary green 10A will be used, for health and safety reasons.
- The vandalism issue is somewhat reduced, though the 3<sup>rd</sup> green and tee box have been damaged and needed repairs. We have concerns as the school summer holidays arrive. If golfers see any such vandalism, will they please report it to the Office, and if possible take photos? The Police have been very positive and helpful and will pick up on any new evidence.
- A new and approved product, in addition to our current plans, will be used in tackling the chafer and leather jacket bug problems.
- Looking ahead, we are trying to limit use of temporary greens in the winter as much as possible. We have taken on board comments from members and will return to and prepare the temporary green in the left corner of the 7th fairway; as we have improved irrigation in front of the 7th green we can tap into that system to water the temporary which would then give the temporary green area the chance to survive.
- Other targets for our winter programme include a comprehensive overhaul of bunkers, irrigation improvements on selective greens and tees, and tree canopy pruning on  $2^{nd}$ ,  $5^{th}$ ,  $6^{th}$  and  $10^{th}$  holes.
- Nature-watch; a small deer was spotted jogging past the 9th green recently. Let us know of any other wildlife sightings.
