Dear Members

Time for winter golf, and winter warmers.

This Newsletter summarises progress on the course, the winter competition results and other Christmas/New Year events coming up.

We also summarise the outcomes of the November AGM, and progress on some of the plans for the longer term future of the Club.



On the Course

Update on Course maintenance programme

- With recent bad weather the 7th temporary has been in use.
- Tees and approaches were all renovated by mid October.

• The 15th fairway was verti-drained to 11 inches deep followed with a top dressing of sand. If drier weather permits, we will repeat this operation. Premier Pitches completed

the shockwave works on greens and it took about 9 days for the greens to settle. We can already see the benefits, as there is less standing water, even after heavy rain.

• Pugh Lewis completed drainage works on the 1st green and we're now seeing the benefits as the green has stood up well after much heavy rain and is no longer our wettest green. We are already back playing on the green, and we plan to undertake similar work on other greens needing drainage e.g.18th.

• Tree work on the 7th green area has been completed. It now allows a lot more light coming through onto the green, and we should see the benefits in the spring. Similar work has been completed around the 3rd and 12th greens, including the removal of some dead trees. Stuart Moore and John Hallam have supported this work by lifting the height of any lower branches on trees around the course, as well as installing fencing in some vulnerable areas to protect from trespassing and vandalism.

• The heights of grass cuts have been raised to winter heights, which means greens are now at 5mm and fairways at 18 mm.

• The Senior Men's section is funding the laying of mats on the pathway from the 18th green to the Clubhouse, and other tee areas with badly worn mats.

- A big, screaming loud plea! While we continue to work hard to get golfers back onto all greens, this work is not being helped by lack of PITCH MARK REPAIRS on greens. When pitch marks are not repaired it can take weeks, if not months, for them to recover. If every member repaired at least one, if not two, PITCH MARKS, then we would not have this problem.
- Additionally, can all buggy users please adhere to the 90 degree rule on fairways, and all buggy and trolley users keep to the paths on par 3's?

New Event in 2024

We are introducing a 10 hole tournament next year on Thursday afternoons from 3-5 pm.

The event is open to members (ladies and gents) and visitors with a recognised handicap. We have a £5 kitty each week and will pay a £50 first prize.

Visitors also pay £10 to play. Players can play without booking a time, just turn up and play after work or leisure. The event runs from May 16th for 10 weeks.

There will be a trophy and tournament prize for the best 7 scores out of 10

Players can play just once or when available.

WHS (World Handicap System) Changes

Members will be aware that a process of review of our course and slope ratings has been under way, including remeasurement by Craig. The course measurement has shown no changes to be needed but there are now in effect some minor changes to the course and slope ratings.

In addition, Craig has measured the winter tees course which has also been rated. This means that WHS qualifying rounds will be possible through the winter months, subject to other conditions.

There are only small changes of 1 or 2 points to the slope ratings, which mean effectively only 1-2% changes to the calculations of playing handicaps

From April 2024 there will be a further change to the system called "Course Rating Minus Par". This probably needs some explanation.

At present a player receives a stroke allowance based on their handicap index adjusted according to the slope index of the course being played and the type of competition they are in. The returned score in that competition is subject to a further adjustment according to the course rating before the adjustment of the WHS handicap index is made.

From April that course rating adjustment will be applied to the stroke allowance changing the number of shots received. This means that the adjustment of WHS handicaps will relate more directly to the score returned in the competition.

For example

A player with a handicap index of 16, playing from the yellow tees, will have Course handicap of 16*slope rating 136 / 113 = 19.2 rounded to 19 Stroke allowance for a stableford is 95% of that = 18 After April Course handicap of 19.2 + course rating 69.3 – par 71 = 17.5 rounded to 18 Stroke allowance for stableford is then x 95% as before = 17 Official explanations for doing this include:-

- Other parts of the world do this already
- It enables competitions to be played on equal terms on more than one set of tees
- Competitions could also be played on different courses

New stroke allowance charts will be acquired and posted after this comes in next year.

Be reassured. You won't be much affected and your golf will still be brilliant!

Plans for the proposed range are still on display in Reception area of the clubhouse. We think we are nearly at the stage of receiving planning permission and are collecting budget costs from various contractors for the construction and equipping of the facility. Recent weather has confirmed the need for field

drainage to be installed so that range balls can in future be collected by machine all year round, so a quote for that is also needed.

Subject to the proposal still seeming viable, we will be looking at ways of financing the project and the most tax efficient arrangements for its future management, minimising risk to the Club.



Meanwhile, we are exploring the potential for a mobile shelter/dry range to give extended use of the practice ground through bad weather. Possible contributions from the Nottinghamshire Union and within our own Club look like this will become possible and an order is expected to be placed soon for delivery in the New Year.

Staffing

We are in the last stage of agreeing with Craig Morris the form in which he will continue to act as our Professional, but with limited involvement in operational responsibilities. He will continue his residency on site and hopes to be offering more coaching time to members and others, whilst continuing to provide the club the benefits of his experience and knowledge.

The recruitment process for a new General Manager is underway and a full month of advertising yielded a very large number of applications. There appear to be some very well qualified and experienced candidates on our shortlist and we are hopeful of agreeing terms with one of them in December for a start around the end of March 2024.

Shop

It is currently proposed that the Club will take over the running of the shop when Craig takes his step back, currently planned to take place at the end of March. The details of that transfer of the business are yet to be determined but we will be advertising for a new staff member to work with Ian to continue to provide a standard of service. Someone working towards a PGA qualification through their Foundation Degree course is thought to be ideal, as they will continue to add to the skills on offer.

Another issue is the member shop accounts which hold, in some cases, significant amounts of credit which Craig is keen to honour in shop sales before he lets go the reins. Members are therefore needed to use any remaining credit in their account before March, through purchases from Craig.

Although it is intended that the Club will set up its own member credit accounts for the distribution of competition prizes etc, exactly how that will work has yet to be decided. It is therefore imperative that members should treat themselves this Christmas and get their credit spent with Craig!!!

Office

The office is also likely to have some major changes with Diane retiring after many years service, early in the new Year.
