Dear Members

Welcome to the second Newsletter of 2019.

This Newsletter looks at progress on the course and the summer programme, the STRI March report, developments on the marketing of the Club and the wider aspects of events at the Club.

Plans and progress on the Course

The March STRI is available on the website www.retfordgolfclub.co.uk

It provides a very positive summary of progress, given the penal impact of the summer drought of 2018.

Work on the course

- Golf courses need grass, and RGC is a prime example of that. After considerable research and discussion, we will be purchasing a <u>Vredo</u> grass seed dispenser, which very efficiently slits the ground, evenly sows seed and covers the slit again. As a major purchase, we shall be using a combination of the annual Capital funding, money raised by the Seniors and Juniors sections, and a John Deere loan. We think that members will appreciate the following explanation of this piece of machinery and the cost-benefit analysis that we think justifies this outlay.
- We had a demonstration of the unit, and green staff were very impressed by the coverage and efficiency. It has a germination rate of

up to 93% and can be used for fairways, greens and tees on a year round basis when conditions permit. Because of the high germination rate, it uses far less seed, saving a substantial sum of money going forward. It is widely regarded as the best machine of its type currently available and has been bought by many clubs. We have been lent the demonstration machine for some days pending the delivery of our own in May. This has enabled us to overseed fairways 2, 8, 13, 14 (twice) 15 and 17. We now hope for rain and warm weather to see the best results.

Spring Programme for course

• Copies of the work programme on the course are on club notice boards. Key points are:

1. Continue to gain putting surfaces. This is the main priority as we will gain more and more growth. We will dress greens through April until greens are perfect.

2. Continue work on fairways including over-seeding to repair last year's drought damage.

3. Continue to rake up debris around the course.

4. Course presentation.

- On Friday 12th April, in the late afternoon, we had a fire on the course in the woods to the left of the 8th fairway, probably started by young intruders. About 200 sq.metres were affected, with burning to a depth of about half a metre. 7 fire engines and 14 firefighters were needed to put out the fire. Sadly, this is the sort of incidental issue that may go unnoticed by members but take up time and worry for greens staff. This is the fifth such incident in the last 12 months requiring fire crews.
- Many thanks to the dozen or so members who turned up for the "divot morning". We managed, with the help of Carl's green staff before, during and after that stint, to complete the whole course. <u>Divot bags</u> have been put out for golfers to repair divots in the fairways.

- The <u>worn and dry patches</u> which have been a problem since last summer's scorching, have responded well to being roped off and seeded, especially on the 13th and 14th fairways.
- A plea, to all members and visitors: please keep all trolleys and buggies well away from fringes and surrounds of the greens. Some players are taking their trolleys/buggies too close to the greens.
- All greens have new flagsticks and cups, which enhance the consistency and appearance of the course. New rakes in bunkers, and consistent sand texture and depth, should also help that aspect of the course.
- The new bunkers on the 10th are now in full play, and look very good.
