Course Update

Winter Programme

- Work on path ends, tees, green surrounds and bunkers will be priorities, as well as the irrigation system.
- There will be a 90 degree rule for buggies to take us through the winter. Buggy users are asked to keep to the rough, and only come onto the fairways at 90 degrees to where their ball lies, to minimise traffic on the fairways. (See details below).

• We hope to appoint an apprentice greenkeeper, to bring our green staff back up to six.

Roping off

We are continuing to rope off vulnerable areas of the course, to help them recover from the summer drought and the traffic from everyday use. We acknowledge the frustrations of members at times, but the longer term survival and improvement of the grass is vital.

This is a national picture; Retford Golf Club is not alone, and we cannot be blind to the bigger picture.

Here is a short precis from National Club Golfer in September 2022.

"Paul Woodham, Head of Agronomy at STRI, says there will be visible scars from the 2022 heat and drought on golf courses. There is a balance to be struck between protecting the courses, and public perception of water use in the drought. We water while the public suffer hosepipe restrictions.

However, we can be more aware by protecting those pinch-point areas, especially the approaches to the greens and under trees, by roping off areas not just in the drought but throughout the year. Similarly, we should consider keeping buggies to the rough as much as possible, all year round, not just in drought times.

There is a cost to doing this – restrictive movement, cost of seed and fertiliser, irrigation – but there is also a "failure cost", of **not** taking action. The bad winters, and dry springs with slow growth of grass and low night temperatures, of the last few years, have contributed to our having to adopt the current emergency/responsible management mode"

Notice to Buggy Users

The use of buggies on the course can lead to significant amounts of damage to the grass etc. Members who use buggies are therefore requested to follow the guidelines below out of consideration for others, particularly in winter when the grass can find it harder to recover. Please observe the following guidelines which have recently been updated and are published in the Shop.

- Drive carefully and with consideration for others at all times.
- Keep to paths and semi rough wherever possible. On holes 3,4,9,11 and 16 buggies must not leave the cart path.

- Do not cross white lines or approach near to greens and tees, especially avoiding roped off areas.
- Cross fairways at right angles.
- Do not enter wooded areas, since this can result in punctures.
- Take extra care when crossing the railway bridge.
- Alcohol must not be consumed before or during the use of buggies,

A Year in the career of our Playing Professional James Freeman

James continues to spread the reputation of Retford Golf Club with great success. 2022 has seen him claim 10 professional tournament victories, come close to qualification for the Open

His 2022 season started back in March and continued through to October with a mixture of Pro-Am competitions, pairs and individual tournaments over 1-4 days. In between competitive golf he still finds time for fitness training, practise, coaching and junior group sessions, which makes him a very busy chap.

The Pro-Am events generally comprise a professional with a team of 3 with individual and team prizes. James often finds himself in demand by teams that he has played with before and he also takes teams of people he knows, including Retford Members. Most are at venues around the East Midlands such as Hollingwell, Radcliffe and Worksop, but he also travels further afield and played Bridlington this year.

The really serious golf gets played in the individual events where James has a great record this year. Highlights include numerous top 5 finishes. Tied 3rd in the Manchester Open was followed by 2nd in the Midland Open, then a win in the Midland English PGA at Sutton Coldfield.

In June he came so close at the final Open qualifying over 2 rounds at Hollingwell. His T7 finish only 2 shots from a place at St Andrews. About 100 people followed his progress as he worked hard to get to the top of the leaderboard recording the low score of the second round, 70 with a birdie birdie birdie finish.

Season completed with a T2 finish in the Midlands Professional chamipionship over 3 holes at Sapey. His scores of 65-64 were -9



under par and he was absolutely thrilled to make the PGA Playoffs next year at PGA Catalunya in Spain, and the chance to qualify for Wentworth and some DP World Tour Events and Challenge Tour Events. This really was the highlight of this season and hopefully the icing on the cake.

James spends many hours on our practice field providing individual coaching to members and visitors and he is equally proud of their achievements. Owen Rafferty has got down to +0.2 and won our club championship, age just 14. Andrew Cooke has progressed from a handicap of 20 down to 0.1 and still comes back to James regularly for coaching. The regular Saturday junior groups cater for all ages and abilities and allows James to identify



when people are ready for more intensive work which often leads to progression into the County Juniors system.

He also hosted our second Junior Invitational event in August

He has had his first season as coach to the Yorkshire County Girls Intermediate Golf Squad alongside the team headed up by Lysa Jones of The Oaks GC in York.

Retford is rightly proud that James has us as his home club and wish him all the best for even more success in 2023. Well done James.

Club Management

Again, an article from National Club Golfer in October sets this in the national scene. Tim Brookes, Chief Executive of the Golf Club Managers' Association, warns that, nationally, rises in prices for energy, water and operational bills (wages, seed, fertiliser, servicing equipment etc) are at least doubled from last winter's levels. It is inevitable that membership fees will have to increase beyond "normal" levels, especially with the inflation rate above 10% now.

Another financial issue is the cash versus card economy. It is now more costly for the Club to deal with cash than card payments. Since every little bit helps, will members please use card payments rather than cash, and especially if topping up your bar card credit?
